

1st Mystery
Jesus Heals the Paralytic



“And they

came bringing a paralytic by four men. And when they could not get near Him because of the crowd, they removed the roof above Him, ... and let down the pallet on which the paralytic lay, and when Jesus saw their faith, He said to the paralytic, “Child, your sins are forgiven.” The scribes sitting there were questioning in their hearts, “Why does this man speak like this? It is blasphemy! Who can forgive, but God alone?” Jesus said to them.., “Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, ‘Your sins are forgiven’ or say, ‘Rise, take up your pallet and walk?’ But that you may know the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins”, He said to the paralytic, “I say to rise, take up your pallet and go home.” And he rose, and immediately took up the pallet and went out before them all...” (Mark 2:1-12)

2nd Mystery
The Multiplication of Loaves & Fish



“His

disciples came to Jesus and said, “This is a lonely place, and the hour is now late; send them away, to go into the country and villages round about and buy themselves something to eat.” But, He answered them, “You give them something to eat.” And they said to Him, “Shall we go and buy two hundred denari worth of bread, and give it to them to eat?” And He said to them, “How many loaves have you? Go and see.”...” They said, “Five, and two fish.” Then He commanded them to all sit down...So they sat down in groups... And taking the five loaves and the two fish, He looked up to heaven, and blessed, and broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples to set before the people; and divided the two fish among them all. And they all ate and were satisfied. And they took up twelve baskets full of broken pieces and of the fish. And those who ate the loaves were five thousand men.” (Mark 6:30-44)

3rd Mystery
Jesus Walks on Water & Calms the Sea



“When evening came, He was there alone, but the boat by this time was many furlongs distant from land, beaten by the waves; for the wind was against them. And in the fourth watch of the night He came to them, walking on the sea, they were terrified, saying, “It is a ghost! And they cried out for fear. But immediately, He spoke to them, saying, “Take heart, it is I; have no fear.”... Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water, and came to Jesus; but when he saw the wind, he was afraid, and beginning to sink he cried out, “Lord, save me.” Jesus immediately reached out His hand and caught him,...And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased. And those in the boat worshiped Him saying, “Truly you are the Son of God.” (Matthew 14:22-32)


4th Mystery Jesus Casts Out a Mute Spirit



"Teacher, I brought my son to you, for he has a mute spirit; and wherever it seizes him, it dashes him down; and he foams and grinds his teeth and becomes rigid; and I asked your disciples to cast it out, and they were not able. And it has often cast him into fire and into water, to destroy him, but, if you can do anything, have pity on us.... Jesus said to him, "If you can! All things are possible with him who believes." The father cried out, "I believe, help my unbelief!" He rebuked the unclean spirit...after crying out and convulsing him terribly, it came out..." "...His disciples asked Him privately, "Why could we not cast it out?" And He said to them, "This kind cannot be driven out by anything but prayer and fasting." (Mark 9:14-29)

The Rosary of Miracles has no indulgences. However, "A Catholic may gain a plenary indulgence by remaining in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for at least a half-hour." So if one were to pray *The Rosary of Miracles* during their time of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for at least a half-hour, or any other prayers, one could receive a Plenary Indulgence.

5th Mystery The Raising of Lazarus



"Lord," Martha said to Jesus, "if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But I know that even now God will give you whatever you ask." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again." Martha answered, "I know he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day." Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" "Yes, Lord," she told him, "I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, who was to come into the world." Jesus, once more deeply moved, came to the tomb. It was a cave with a stone laid across the entrance. "Take away the stone," he said. "But, Lord," said Martha, the sister of the dead man, "by this time there is a bad odor, for he has been there four days." Then Jesus said, "Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone.... Jesus called in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come forth!" And presently he that had been dead came forth, bound feet and hands with winding bands; and his face was bound about with a napkin. Jesus said to them: "Loose him, and let him go. (cf. John 11:1-56)

The Rosary of Miracles



"He performed those great *miracles* before our very peoples through whom we passed. Therefore we also will serve the Lord, for He is our God." (Joshua 24:17). Every event in the life of Christ is beneficial for our salvation. By meditating on the miracles of Jesus we receive graces. The Lord wants us to remember and meditate upon His miracles, because through them He is glorified and He reveals His love for us. Psalm 145 states, "One generation shall laud thy works to another, and shall declare thy mighty acts. On the glorious splendor of thy majesty, and on thy wondrous works, I will *meditate*." (Psalm 145:4-5) God desires we meditate on every good thing He has done, because by remembering His miracles, we are reminded of His power, His glory, His divinity, and His love. Jesus, as God, worked miracles so we may believe in Him. A faithful Christian regularly meditates on the Gospels. So why not meditate on the miracles of Jesus with the Heart of Mary, while praying Her Holy Rosary? Please don't substitute the Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful & Glorious mysteries with the *Rosary of Miracles*. Rather, pray an extra *Rosary of Miracles*.
